ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
 (Under Chapter 1702 of the Ohio Revised Code)
 Non-Profit Corporation

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation, not for profit, under Sections 1702.01 et seq. of the Ohio Revised Code, do hereby state the following:

FIRST. The name of said corporation shall be The National Association for Members
of Campground Resorts, Condominiums, and Timeshares

SECOND. The place in Ohio where its principal office is to be located is 4740 Silver Oak Street
Dayton, Montgomery County, Ohio.

THIRD. The purpose(s) for which this corporation is formed is:

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

The organization will operate in the public interest as a non-profit corporation for the purpose of conducting, sponsoring and encouraging study and research on issues important to protect the well-being, security, and comfort of people who use campground resorts, condominiums and time shares. It will compile, publish, and disseminate reports and other documents that can be used to educate the general public and government officials on those issues and potential solutions to related problems. Information will also be obtained and disseminated in discussion groups, forums, lectures, panels, etc.

State and/or regional associations will be established by members of this corporation to support the purposes stated above.

It will operate on behalf of members and non-members alike with funds obtained from gifts, grants, and donations.

Forth: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Fifth: Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively.

FOURTH. The following persons, not less than three, shall serve said corporation as trustees until the first annual meeting or other meeting called to elect trustees.
